Competitiveness

 Competitiveness Review identified need for regulatory changes

- Regulatory system must keep pace and remain competitive
- Task Force established to oversee comprehensive review

Regulatory Enhancement Project

- Comprehensive review undertaken to ensure that Alberta's policy assurance system is:
 - Modern
 - Efficient
 - Performance based
 - Competitive
 - Continues to maintain Alberta's strong commitment to environmental management, public safety and responsible resource development




Outcomes Based Approach

- Aim is to improve overall outcomes and balance economic, environmental and social goals
- Gain more clarity upfront to help industry and others plan for the future
- A focus on strategic level objectives or desired end-states
- Provides for innovation and flexibility. Less prescriptive

Regulatory Structures

- Separate, multiple regulators
 - Conduct activities independently
- Coordinated
 - Harmonize or synchronize similar activities
- Aligned
 - Formal efforts to coordinate activities
- Integrated
 - Single regulator provides activities







Recommendations

Recommendations to better integration of oil and gas policy and regulatory system

- Single oil and gas regulatory body
- Policy Management Office
- Clear public engagement processes
- Common approach to risk assessment and management
- Performance measures and continuous system improvement
- Mechanism to resolve disputes and enforce landowner agreements





Single Regulator


- Single regulator will assume all oil, natural gas, oil sands and coal functions currently with the ERCB, SRD and ENV
- This does not include mineral tenure or Surface Rights Board functions
- Expect the regulator will be a corporation at arm's-length from Government



Policy Management Office

Work is underway on how to best establish a policy management office

 Establishing the policy management office and the single regulator will be pivotal to moving all the recommendations forward







Implementation and transition

- Significant and complex undertaking to change a system that has evolved over decades
- Certainty and predictability required thorough period of change
- Legislation to be introduced 2012
